Introduction to our Service of Healing

Our world is filled with brokenness and pain. We are in need of God's healing. We join together today to pray for our world, our family, friends and for ourselves. Here each person may receive a word of blessing and prayer. Here each one give themselves a physical gesture of healing: putting our hands over our heart and dipping our finger in oil or water and putting that oil or water on your forehead in the shape of a cross. These signs, first given in baptism, tell us again that we are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ, who is health and salvation for the whole world.



Pastor: May the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bless you and keep you in God's grace.


Post Communion Prayer

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
