## First Reading                      Exodus 1:8-14

<sup>8</sup> Now a new king arose over Egypt, who did not know Joseph. <sup>9</sup> He said to his people, “Look, the Israelite people are more numerous and more powerful than we. <sup>10</sup> Come, let us deal shrewdly with them, or they will increase and, in the event of war, join our enemies and fight against us and escape from the land.” <sup>11</sup> Therefore they set taskmasters over them to oppress them with forced labor. They built supply cities, Pithom and Rameses, for Pharaoh. <sup>12</sup> But the more they were oppressed, the more they multiplied and spread, so that the Egyptians came to dread the Israelites. <sup>13</sup> The Egyptians became ruthless in imposing tasks on the Israelites, <sup>14</sup> and made their lives bitter with hard service in mortar and brick and in every kind of field labor. ## **The Holy Gospel      Mark 12:18-27**

<sup>18</sup> Some Sadducees, who say there is no resurrection, came to him and asked him a question, saying, <sup>19</sup>“Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man’s brother dies, leaving a wife but no child, the man shall marry the widow and raise up children for his brother. <sup>20</sup> There were seven brothers; the first married and, when he died, left no children; <sup>21</sup> and the second married the widow and died, leaving no children; and the third likewise; <sup>22</sup> none of the seven left children. Last of all the woman herself died. <sup>23</sup> In the resurrection whose wife will she be? For the seven had married her.”

<sup>24</sup> Jesus said to them, “Is not this the reason you are wrong, that you know neither the scriptures nor the power of God? <sup>25</sup> For when they rise from the dead, they neither marry nor are given in marriage, but are like angels in heaven. <sup>26</sup> And as for the dead being raised, have you not read in the book of Moses, in the story about the bush, how God said to him, ‘I am the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob’? <sup>27</sup> God is God not of the dead, but of the living; you are quite wrong.”

This is the Gospel of the Lord.






